EDUCATION SKILLS STATISTICS

Missouri Educator Evaluation System (MEES) scores

The *MEES* exam is the capstone assessment required by the State of Missouri (it replaced the MoPTA assessment). This assessment is required for graduation from an approved program and teacher certification in Missouri. For AY 2018-2019, the State established the minimum passing score of 24. For AY 2019-20 and beyond, the State established the minimum passing score of 42. All Education students at BBC are required to PASS this exam which is completed during student teaching (senior year).

Fall 2015 – Spring 2017 Missouri Pre-Service Teacher Assessment (MoPTA) scores

The *MoPTA* exam was the capstone assessment required by the State of Missouri prior to the MEES (effective 2018). This assessment was required for graduation from an approved program and teacher certification in Missouri. According to the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (MO-DESE), "The Missouri Pre-Service Teacher Assessment (MoPTA) is designed to demonstrate performance in content, coursework, and field experiences during the candidates' internship(s). The tasks are focused on the standards and quality indicators for Missouri teachers." The State established the minimum passing score of 37. All Education students at BBC were required to PASS this exam which was completed during student teaching (senior year).

2014 – 2019 Missouri Content Assessments (MoCA) scores

The *MoCA* exam is also considered a capstone assessment by the State of Missouri. This assessment is required for graduation from an approved program and teacher certification in Missouri. According to the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (MO-DESE), “The content area assessments are exit assessments that must be completed by the candidate in all areas of certification. The Missouri Content Assessments replaced the Praxis II Content Assessments beginning on September 2, 2014.” All Education students at BBC are required to PASS this exam which is typically completed prior to or during their student teaching (senior year).

2013 – 2019 Missouri General Education Assessment (MoGEA) scores

The *MoGEA* exam is used by the State of Missouri for admission into undergraduate educator preparation programs. According to the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (MO-DESE), “This test includes sections on English language arts, writing, mathematics, science and social science. The assessment began in September 2013 and replaced the College BASE (CBASE) test.” All students at BBC seeking admission to the Education unit are required to take and successfully complete all sections of this exam which is typically completed during their sophomore year.
